

POLDING RUGBY LEAGUE - SELECTIONS OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES

1. General Rules			Refer to <u>NSWCPS General Rules</u>
2. Event Requirements	1	a	 Venue A minimum of 1 Rugby League field per age division clearly marked in accordance with the rules. Each field requires goal posts with padding at each end of the field. Room accessible for staff - lunch, selection discussions. Catering available for Officials & Team Managers. Canteen if available. If a canteen is not available this information is to be included in diocesan information packs indicating that students will be required to supply their own food. Adequate parking. A traffic management plan made available if needed.
		b	Officials i) Officials to be sourced from NRL development officer x 2. ii) Rugby league accredited referees sourced from local NSW Rugby League Group. iii) Polding Team Managers x 2. iv) Diocese are required to provide adequate supervision for their Diocesan players.
		c	 First Aid A designated first aid officer must be in attendance and be visible. A first aid officer should be equipped with ice and medical supplies including for the treatment of asthma and anaphylaxis. Physiotherapy & taping services will not be provided at selections by the designated first aid officer. First aid officer to be informed of any students at high risk by Team Manager. Diocesan Team Managers should access the medical information on each student from the CSNSW website. Players should ensure that they have an adequate level of hydration before, during, and after the game or training session. Students participating at outdoor venues are to be instructed to use adequate sun protection, e.g. an SPF50+, broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen reapplied regularly and a hat where appropriate. Concussion It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to inform team management of any concussion recently sustained. Any student who has sustained a recent concussion injury may not return to contact/collision activities until the resolution of all symptoms. Each sport may have specific guidelines from the National Sport Organisation in relation to returning to play after a concussion. For further information refer to Sports Medicine Australia A medical clearance must be provided to your Diocesan Representative prior to the

d	Eligibility i) Students must be enrolled in a CSNSW Sport affiliated school. ii) Students must progress through the Diocesan pathway. iii) Diocesan entries -
	 Armidale - red, blue and white. Bathurst - bottle green and white. Broken Bay - royal blue and white. Lismore - black and white. Maitland Newcastle -emerald green and white. Wilcannia Forbes - green and gold. iv) Duty of care and diocesan discretion on age and/or grade may narrow the age range: Open division -Students turning 10 - 13 in the year of the competition are eligible. 11's division -Students turning 10 - 11 in the year of the competition are eligible. v) Principal consent is required for any student to attend selections. vi) Each diocesan team consists of a maximum of fifteen (15) players. vii) Students turning 8, 9 or 13 in the year of competition may be selected in a Polding team, but may not be selected in a NSWPSSA Open Rugby League Team for School Sport Australia Champion.

3. Event Details	1	a	Date i) Selection date - First Friday of Term Two determined by the Polding Council based on availability of venue and calendar. iii) Entry Closing Date for Diocese - determined by Convener (usually 2 weeks prior to event).
	2	a	 Registration i) All students selected to represent their Diocese will be progressed to Polding by their Diocese following diocesan selections. ii) Students must register and pay a levy on the CSNSW portal for the Polding Selections with both parent/guardian and Principal consent. iii) CSNSW Sport will invoice Dioceses for participant levy after the event. iv) Team list will be downloaded from the CSNSW portal by the convenor 2 weeks prior to the trial.
	3	a	Format i) Suggested timeline- 8:30am Managers meeting. 8:50am Welcome and induction. 9:00am Games commence. Manager meeting and break. Games resume. Team manager selectors meeting. Possibles v Probables. 2:00pm Announcement of Polding teams. Distribution of uniforms to Polding team.

	b	The duration of games shall be determined by the number of students and weather. The carnival convener reserves the right to alter the program.
	с	No scores shall be kept.
4	a	Equipment 4 size 4 Mod League footballs as approved by the Australian Rugby League. Each team provides a First receiver (FR) vest of one colour and a Dummy Half (DH) vest of another colour Pads for posts provided by the club. Corner posts provided by the club. 20 witches hats provided by development officers. Timer. Signal horn. Sound system. Speakers.
	b	 Convenor Documentation Polding certificates. Program . Selectors pack - clipboards, program, team list each team, lunch voucher, possible probable sheets. Managers pack - clipboards, program, team list for each team, 3,2,1 booklet, lunch voucher. A3 copies of the draw, A4 copies of the draw. Prayer, acknowledgement, induction, structure of day, selections. Stationery/ utilities pack - blue tac, tape, staples, scissors. Polding paperwork. Risk assessment. Accident report. First aid signage.

4. Rules & Guidelines	1	a	The competition is to be run under the <u>National Junior Rugby League's laws</u> for twelve (12) years and eleven (11) years respectively and must incorporate the <u>National Safe Play Code</u> .
		b	Maximum playing time 90 mins.

	с	13 players take the field.

5. Selection criteria	1	a	Selection panel to be composed of the appointed Polding Team managers and NSW Rugby League Development Officers.
		b	Selection panel will liaise and collaborate with Diocesan team officials.
		с	Diocesan managers to give 3,2,1 points to the opposing team.
		d	Selection will be based on demonstrated ability on the day of selection.
			The areas of performance considered are:
			i) Skills. ii) Fitness level. iii) Performance of the player as a member of a team. iv) Attitude and behaviour of player both on and off the field. v) Positions played.
		e	Team selections conclude with a Possibles v Probables game.
		f	A paper selection may occur if circumstances arise.
		g	A Polding Open and 11's team of seventeen (17) players will be selected to represent Polding at the NSW Primary School Sports Association (NSWPSSA) State Championships.
		h	The selected Polding team will be progressed by CSNSW staff.
